- A self-starter, willing and able to work at a strategic level

What will you be doing?

- You will be matched to a local school, Pupil Referral Unit or special school and will meet with their career leader on a termly basis.
- You will act as a critical friend to the career leader and help build a comprehensive career program that meets the <u>Gatsby Benchmarks</u>.



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- You will use your network to introduce employers from a range of sectors to the classroom so the students can hear first-hand about different careers and have the opportunity to experience different workplaces.
- You will support the Career Leader to raise the profile of careers to the school senior leadership team and highlight the impact of quality careers education across the whole school.
- You will be part of a nationwide network of business volunteers supporting career educators and have access to substantial training, support, and resources.
