

The Civil Service

The Civil Service supports the government across the UK to deliver policy and initiatives to support society. There are a broad range of apprenticeships, all of which are advertised on Civil Service Jobs, and applications are accepted from anyone aged 16 or older who has the right to work in the UK. The current Civil Service has an apprenticeships strategy target to ensure 2.3% of their workforce are apprentices, a plan which is designed to support increased social mobility and equality of opportunity.

The Civil Service apprenticeship commitment strives to embed best practice around apprentices through sharing professional insights with colleagues throughout the public sector, and to use their apprenticeship goals to support the wider agendas of Places for Growth, Civil Service for Everyone and Levelling-Up.

The varieties of Civil Service apprenticeship depends on where within the Civil Service it is located, and there are opportunities across all the Civil Service functions, with particular strengths in Operational Delivery, Finance and Tax, Human Resources, and Digital, Data and Technology.

Within England, there were 7,841 new apprenticeship starts in 2020/21 and 17,304 apprentices on a programme at the end of the same financial year. This represents 2.2% of the current Civil Service headcount in England, a figure that has increased from 1.3% in 2017/18, showing our progress towards our statutory target. In the 2022 - 2025 Strategy the scope and variety of apprenticeships will be increased across the UK – building on the current geographic distribution throughout England, with fewer than 1-in-5 based in London and over a third located in the North of England.

Nikki Hanmer, who is undertaking an HMRC Level 4 policy apprenticeship, joining the Civil Service was a dramatic change from her previous career in retail and marketing. With a nine-year old daughter to look after, Nikki had always found it difficult to devote the time needed for her own development. Completing a Civil Service apprenticeship gave her the opportunity to grow her skills, alongside a work/life balance which allows her take care of her family. Apprenticeships are not simply an alternative route for school-leavers, but a valuable development pathway for people of all ages, and allows career progression from many previous backgrounds - 65% of apprentices who started between 2016 and 2021 came from outside the Civil Service.

Our partners the Careers and Enterprise Company, work with schools, colleges and employers to help every young person find their best next step. The role of the Careers Leader is one of the most important roles in education; supporting colleagues, SLT and governors to embed careers across schools, special schools and colleges. The CEC provides resources, support and training to help ensure you can provide students with the knowledge, skills and understanding needed for the future. Including real world learning, knowledge, inspiration and advice gained through multiple employer and workplace engagements, exposure to further and higher education, as well as through the curriculum and in one-to-one personal guidance.

Their training courses help Careers Leaders understand their role and develop the skills required to strategically embed a careers programme in their school or college. All Careers Leaders working in state-funded secondary schools and colleges, including SEND and AP, are eligible to apply for a fully funded training place.
