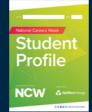

SUTTON TRUST – Paving The Way report.

We are delighted that our friends at The Sutton Trust decided to issue their new research report into careers guidance in Secondary schools – Paving The Way – during #NCW2022.

The Sutton Trust champions social mobility through evidence-based programmes, agenda setting research and advocacy and this report highlights their findings when analysing what has been happening with careers guidance in 11-18 education in the UK.

Working with a similar mission to us to break social-mobility boundaries through targeted action, we want to highlight the key findings of the research here and provide a link to the report so you can access the information yourselves and see what you could do to help achieve the best careers outcomes for your students.

Paving The Way key findings:

- 32% of state school teachers said they don't have enough funding to deliver good quality careers guidance, compared to just 6% of private school teachers;
- 38% of state school pupils said that they had not taken part in any careers activities, considerably more than the 23% of private school pupils who claimed the same;
- 75% of state school teachers said that the pandemic had negatively affected their ability to deliver careers education;
- Less than a third of pupils aged 14 to 16 have completed work experience;
- 36% of secondary school students do not feel confident about their next steps in education and training;

So what are the solutions? The Sutton Trust argues that whilst there has been some decent progress in recent years, there is still a growing gap between careers advice at state and private schools AND that more needs to be done across the board to improve careers provision, activities and aspirations.

Their headline recommendations are included on the next page and we wholeheartedly agree with them and as you will know, we support educators at all levels, for free, to deliver them...and will continue to do so.



Our Recommendations

- The government should develop a new national strategy on careers education.
- ☑ Every school should have a Careers Leader, access to a professional careers adviser, and be in a 'Careers Hub'.
- ☑ All Pupils should have access to work experience between the ages of 14 and 16.

Feature: Civil Service, joining the Operational Delivery Profession

The Operational Delivery Profession (ODP) is the largest profession across the Civil Service, involving around 250,000 of 465,000 civil servants. The ODP team provide services directly to the public or support those who do. Examples of these positions include:

- Keeping our borders safe, within the Home Office Border Force team
- Supporting people back into employment, as work coaches within the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP)
- Keeping the country running by collecting taxes, within Her Majesty's Revenue & Customs (HMRC)
- Protecting animal welfare, and the environment as part of the Department for Rural Affairs (DEFRA)

The cross-government Operational
Delivery Profession Central
Apprenticeship Team is here to support
all the different departments listed above
and many more, to ensure that everyone
on an apprenticeship has a quality
learning experience.

The apprenticeships offered allow individuals to work on the front-line, in different public facing roles, within the Civil Service and build a professional

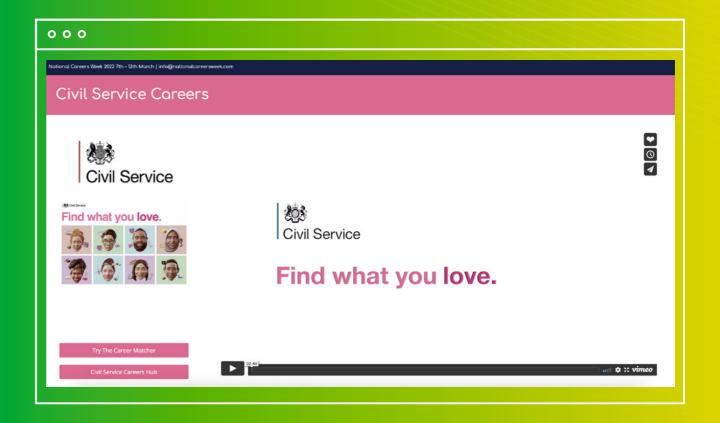

Some of the apprenticeships they offer also allow individuals to achieve an Operational Delivery qualification alongside an apprenticeship, achieving professional accreditation. This is just one of many benefits to completing one.

The team has been working hard to develop products, to show school/college leavers throughout the UK, the hundreds of apprenticeship opportunities offered every year and the benefits they can offer, regardless of a personal situation, opening up the Civil Service for all.
